National Improvement Framework - vision


- **Excellence through raising attainment:** ensuring that every child achieves the highest standards in literacy and numeracy and the right range of skills, qualifications and achievements to allow them to succeed; and
- **Achieving equity:** ensuring every child has the same opportunity to succeed. The Scottish Attainment Challenge will help to focus our efforts and deliver this ambition.



Information we gather that tells us how well we are doing at school level and national level

How parents and carers can support children in their learning and improve the work of the school


How well children are progressing in their learning including what you do outside school



How the school listens to children's views and makes how children learn and their school better

How well children are supported to lead their own learning and play an important role in the life and work of the school. How well the people who lead their school, eg the Head Teacher and Staff, make sure children have a good experience and that children achieve well

Teachers are up-to-date with current approaches to learning, teaching and assessment and use this knowledge to help children.



Children and the National Improvement Framework

Children are at the **centre** of the National Improvement Framework



- Vision – excellence and equity for all children
- Priorities - improvements in your literacy and numeracy, and health and well being
- Focus on the children who are most disadvantaged
- Improvement to the range and quality of information for you to support your learning journey
- Parents/ carers have better information to support you and your school
